- -Special Olympics vs. Mascoutah EMS, Firefighters, and Police went well and may possibly become a yearly event.
- -Dawna from United Way will be at LCC on March 10 at 10:30.
- -Local art show Metro East Art Show will be put on with the help of the Mascoutah Public Library. Event is set for April 29, 2023.
- -Jenna is meeting with Peter Neidorff and will be attending lunches with companies that could be prospective donors.
- -Reached out to Lynn at the City of Mascoutah to discuss budget and what funds are available to LCC.
- -Large recent donations include \$2000 from the Mascoutah Township Offices, \$3000 from the Masonic Lodge, and \$1000 from MAC for new basketballs that will be used with the Shoot the Rock program.
- -Applied for Purina Cares Day. Ryan and Alaina are working together to find a project that Purina can complete for their service day.

- -Horseshoe players will be done in April if they do not get anymore players.
